The Financialization of Foreign Policy: Targeted Financial Sanctions, Vulnerability, and Government Retaliation

This project identifies how political vulnerability influences the conditions under which governments retaliate in response to the imposition of targeted financial sanctions. It uses the Targeted Financial Sanctions Dataset, a dataset of targeted financial sanctions imposed between 2011 and 2019 by the United States. The project employs a multimethod research design, using quantitative analyses of the dataset and case studies of sanction episodes imposed in Venezuela and Russia to test hypotheses.
